The training awards and keys are designed to recognize unit Scouters for tenure, training, and performance in their leadership roles. I'd bet a lot of you are already doing most or all of the work to earn these awards. With a little effort to track it, you'll be proudly showing your Scouts that you are working hard to give them a great program.

Den Leader Training



Tenure: 1 Year

Training:

- Complete the basic training for the position
- Attend a pow wow or University of Scouting (or equivalent), or attend at least four roundtables (or equivalent) during the tenure

Performance:

Do 5 of the following:

- Have an assistant den leader who meets regularly with your den.
- Have a den chief who meets regularly with your den.
- Graduate at least 70 percent of your den to the next level.
- Take leadership in planning and conducting a den service project.
- Have a published den meeting/activity schedule for the den's parents.
- Participate with your den in a Cub Scout day camp or resident camp.

Scouter's Training Award



Tenure: 2 Years

Training:

- Complete the basic training for the leader position
- Attend a pow wow or University of Scouting (or equivalent), or attend at least four roundtables (or equivalent) during the tenure

Performance:

Unique for each BSA Program (i.e. Cub, Scouts BSA, Venturing), but include items regarding:

- Annual Planning
- JTE Achievement
- Giving leadership supporting JTE
- Participate in one supplemental or advanced training at the council, area, region, or national level

*This award can also be earned by District Committee Members

Scouter's Key



Tenure: 3 Years

Training:

- Complete the basic training for the unit leader position
- Attend a pow wow or University of Scouting (or equivalent), or attend at least four roundtables (or equivalent) during the tenure

Performance:

Unique for each BSA Program (i.e. Cubmaster's Key, Scoutmaster's Key, Advisor's Key), but include items regarding:

- Annual Planning
- JTE Achievement
- Outdoor Program
- Participate in one supplemental or advanced training at the council, area, region, or national level

*This award can also be earned by District Committee Members
